Pool Rules

1. An adult will accompany a child in the baby pool AT ALL TIMES. Additionally, a child or non-swimmer in the large pool will also have to be accompanied by a parent or guardian age 16 years old or older. While we allow non-swimmers to wear floaties and life jackets while in the pool, there should still be supervision from a responsible party.
2. Swimmers must wear appropriate swim attire. No basketball shorts or cut-offs allowed. Colored t-shirts are not allowed in the pool. White t-shirts are permissible.
3. Babies and toddlers who are not potty trained must wear swim diapers when in the main pool and baby pool. Regular diapers are not permitted in the pools.
4. Cocoa Butter, Baby Oil, Hair Products, and other similar products are prohibited. Use the shower before entering the pool if these products were applied.
5. Diving in 4 foot depth or less is not permitted.
6. Swimming in the deep end is not permitted while the board is open for diving.
7. Deep end is reserved for proficient swimmers only. A swimming test may be required at lifeguard's discretion.
8. Only one person is allowed on the diving board at a time. Divers must jump straight and not toward the sides.
9. Flotation items designed for use in swimming pools are allowed, but are restricted to small size tubes and Floaties. These flotation items are only permitted in 4 ft & 5ft deep section away from the edge of the pool. Floaties or tubes are not to be used as a substitute for a life jacket.
10. Bicycles, Scooters, Skateboards, or other like items are not permitted in the pool area.
11. Animals are not allowed in the pool area.
12. Loud music, profane and abusive language, and fighting are prohibited.
13. No running in the pool area. Horse playing and rough housing in the pool area or the pool are prohibited.
14. No glass containers or alcoholic beverages are permitted in the pool area.
15. An hourly 15 minute rest period for children is provided during which all swimmers under the age of 18 must exit the pool and remain at least 3 feet away from the pool and diving board.
16. The pool may be closed at the lifeguard's discretion in case of emergency.
17. For the safety of swimmers, if thunder is heard or lightning is visible the pool will be cleared and will re-open in 30 minutes from the last sound of thunder or sight of lightning.
18. Swimmers must obey lifeguard's whistles and warnings.
19. Lifeguards are employed for the safety of the swimmers. They have the ultimate authority to remove anyone from the area who violates these rules or endangers the safety of other persons in the pool area.
20. Immediate enforcement of the rules is the responsibility of the lifeguards.
